Chairman's Notes

Once again the work around the track was completed just in time. We now have a new disabled access ramp into the steaming bays and a ramp down from the unloading area. The two concrete bases for the carriage sheds have been laid and the proposed sheds will be built in the New Year. Also laid was the new base on the opposite side of the platform.

We will be laying a row of coping stones, 50 – 60mm high, either side of the beam the full length of both platforms. This will provide the anti tipping for the trolleys, so getting rid of the wedges that we have been using over the past years.

The Santa Special was well attended by members helping to set up and run the event. The morning started cold and frosty, but that did not deter the drivers from steaming up ready to run, ensuring that we were all ready for our first passengers who arrived on time. Peggy served us with a cooked breakfast in the morning and later a hot lunch. Many of the parents thanked the Society for running the event and the children all left happy with their gifts.

Once the last train had pulled into the station and the children had been in to see Santa that signalled the time to take everything down for another year and this could not have been easier, with all

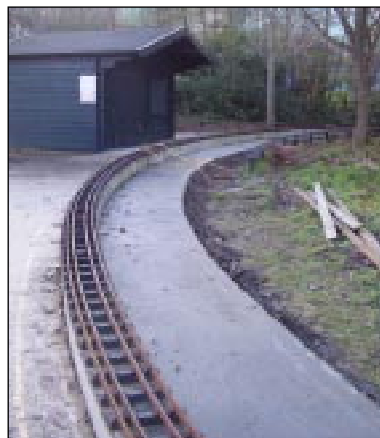
Projects for the New Year:
